



#### **Gulf County Allocations**



#### **Project Submission Process**

- Portal will open on October 19th, 2015
- Portal will close on November 30th, 2015
- All project information must be completed by Portal Close Date
- Reviewers will contact submitters if additional information is needed
- After Portal Close Date, all submitted projects will be evaluated against adopted criteria
- Public RAC meetings will be held in February-March 2016 to discuss rankings

Relate predicted outcomes to best available science such as literature research, best management practices, past project experience, etc.

# Answer all questions thoroughly.

Provide concise and direct responses relative to the Selection Criteria.

Provide examples or other evidence that clearly links your project to the Criteria.
